Business Leadership Program students must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 in all university work. Only courses for which the student has received a C or better count for the major. In addition, students must earn a grade of C- or better in all prerequisite courses.

*These major requirements may be used to fulfill university core requirements.

+Two quantitative units including MATH 160 or 260 and an additional unit of MATH 150+ or one of the following: CSCI 161, ECON 284, PSYC 201 or PHIL 240.

- 1) ECON 101, MATH 160 or 260, and BUS 205 are prerequisites for BUS 315.
- 2) Students must register for cohort BLP sections of ECON 101, MATH 160 (unless taking 260), BUS 305, 310, 315, 340, and 385.
- 3) Students must complete the foundational courses (BUS 205, 305, 310, 315, and 340) and have senior standing before taking the senior research seminar. Check course descriptions, as well as semester by semester course offerings, for 400-level BUS classes to determine if they fulfill the Senior Research Seminar requirement. Courses approved: BUS 432, 476, 478, 482, and 485.
- 4) Of the three units of upper division coursework required outside the first major, the Connections course will count for one unless it is used to meet a major requirement.

NOTES

BLP students continue in the program as long as they: (a) complete BLP seminars with a passing grade; (b) meet with their mentors regularly sophomore through senior years; (c) maintain a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA. Students falling below 3.0 GPA minimum may apply for a probationary period to bring the cumulative GPA back up to 3.0 or be dismissed from the program.

Only courses for which the student has received a C or better count for the major. In addition, students must earn a grade of C- or better in all prerequisite courses.

BUS 205, ECON 101 and MATH 160 or 260 must be completed before enrollment in BUS 315.

Two quantitative units to include MATH 160 or 260 and one additional unit of MATH 150+; CSCI 161, ECON 284, PSYCH 201 or PHIL 240 can be used to satisfy the additional math requirement. BLP students must take one of the MATH units in residence.

Students planning to pursue advanced electives in finance or a graduate degree in business, such as an MBA, are encouraged to take calculus (MATH 180 or 181).

#These major requirements may be used to fulfill university core requirements.

*Business electives (2 units at the 300-400 level) to exclude the following courses: BUS 300 and 316; CONN 387, 390, and 478.

**Students must complete the foundational courses (BUS 205, 305, 310, 315, and 340) and have senior standing before taking the Senior Research Seminar. Courses approved: BUS 432, 476, 478, 482, and 485.

Courses used to satisfy the business electives and senior research seminar requirements may not also be used to satisfy university core requirements.

A minimum of five BUS courses toward the major must be completed in residence at Puget Sound or a waiver approved.

Students may pursue one or more Concentrations (Accounting, Finance, International, Legal Studies, and Sustainability). See "Business Major Concentrations" in the Bulletin for details and additional requirements of each.
