How To Recognize an Indian When You See One: British Illustrated Newspapers and the Production of Images

On May 10, 1867, the *sipahis* (Indian soldiers) of the British East India Company's army in India mutinied, initiating the most significant challenge to British colonialism on the subcontinent. For Britons, one of the villains of the Uprising was a man named Nana Sahib about whom they knew little. In September two illustrated London newspapers were each able to procure an image of the "arch-fiend" – though the images are of two patently different men. This talk examines the dueling images to analyze forms of representation – visual, judicial, and sovereign – at play and the role the mass-production of images played in fixing Indians.
