Joseph Williams is an active freelance pianist in the Seattle-Tacoma area. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C. to various schools throughout Amman, Jordan. He teaches piano at Federal Way School of Music and Annie Wright Schools while directing Tukwila Kids Make Music, a program which offers group piano instruction to Tukwila children at no cost. Chorong Park completed her doctoral degree in Collaborative Piano at the University of Texas at Austin with Anne Epperson in 2016. She has been a staff pianist at the Meadowmount School of Music since 2015. Before pursuing her D.M.A, she completed fellowships in collaborative piano at the Aspen Music Festival and School (2010), Music Academy of the West (2012, 2013), and Bard College Conservatory of Music (2011-2013).

The **Sonata n. 2** in A minor, is part of J.S. Bach's six sonatas and partitas; Works for unaccompanied violin composed in the early 1700's.

The **Tempus Suite** is a work for unaccompanied violin written by M. Tirado while he completed his studies in music composition at Pacific Lutheran University in 2016-17.

The **Introduction and Rondo Capriccioso** is a work written for violin and orchestra in 1863 dedicated to the violinist Pablo De Sarasate. Originally intended to be the first movement of a violin concerto in A minor, it eventually became a stand-alone, one movement show piece by that title.
